Since the onset of this virus, we have had 77 residents and 44 staff members test positive for COVID-19. Our residents are continually monitored for any signs and symptoms of COVID-19 every shift while adhering to all CDC guidelines with regard to our staffing practices.

We are happy to report that Julia Manor completed our 3rd vaccination clinic through Walgreens this past Monday, February 8th, where many of our residents and staff received their 2nd dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. This continues to be the best defense against the virus and we at Julia Manor are doing all that we can to promote wellness via our vaccination clinics and other efforts.

Please accept this letter as our weekly update regarding the status of COVID-19 in our facility. Since the onset of this virus, we have had 77 residents and 44 staff members test positive for COVID-19. Our residents are continually monitored for any signs and symptoms of COVID-19 every shift while adhering to all CDC guidelines with regard to our staffing practices.

Julia Manor remains in outbreak status due to a positive staff member earlier this month. Unfortunately, we have to be cleared of our outbreak by the Health Department as well as have our county positivity rate (currently 13.4% via CMS) under 10% before we are able to resume in person visitation. We have a plan in place once these stipulations have been met and look forward to getting families in for visits as soon as possible. More information to follow as we progress and remain COVID free.

As always, we are working hard to keep everyone in our community safe and we will continue to practice the enhanced safety precautions that are known to prevent the spread of COVID-19, such as only essential personnel are allowed inside the facility and we screen them for signs and symptoms of illness prior to entering. Since the onset of this virus, we have had 77 residents and 44 staff members test positive for COVID-19.
