

WEEKLY UPDATE

Dear Residents and Families/Representatives,

Please accept this letter as our weekly update regarding the status of COVID-19 in our facility. Since the onset of this virus, we have had 77 residents and 45 staff members test positive for COVID-19. Our residents are continually monitored for any signs and symptoms of COVID-19 every shift while adhering to all CDC guidelines throughout our facility.

I want to thank everyone that participated in outdoor visitation this past week at Julia Manor. Mother Nature threw us a curve ball with the unseasonably cold weather we experienced on Wednesday and Thursday, and please know that your patience and understanding is truly appreciated. Thankfully, Washington County's positivity rate via CMS dropped to 8.9% so we can resume indoor visitation! The schedule will remain the same and we look forward to our special visitation hours this Saturday! As always, please contact our front desk if you would like to schedule a visit. I look forward to meeting all of you!

Also, Mother's Day is quickly approaching (May 9th). We are looking to accommodate as many families as we can for visitation with their mother on this treasured day. Please contact our front desk by May 2nd if you are looking to schedule a visit with your motherly figure on this date as we are looking to arrange times for all families who are able to attend. When calling in, please indicate whether you prefer a morning or afternoon time slot and we will do our best to arrange the schedule appropriately. In addition, we are asking all families who have a mother/grandmother/Godmother in our facility to provide a picture of her with her family along with a brief write up describing your mother and what she has meant to your family. We will utilize these pictures and descriptions to create a PowerPoint presentation to share with all of our residents. We think this is something our residents will truly enjoy!

As always, we are working hard to keep everyone in our community safe and we will continue to practice the enhanced safety precautions that are known to prevent the spread of COVID-19, such as only essential personnel are allowed inside the facility and we screen them for signs and symptoms of illness prior to entering. Our residents are continually monitored and staff is using PPE as recommended by the CDC. Staff is frequently reminded and encouraged to practice social distancing and to use hand sanitizer and frequently wash their hands when they are in the facility and out in the community. We ask them not to report to work if they have symptoms of illness.

Please continue to check our website for weekly updates as well as notification of new cases. As always, we will reach out to you individually if your loved one is displaying symptoms of COVID-19 or tests positive for COVID-19.
